Our Policies on Human Trafficking and Slavery

We are committed to making sure there is no modern slavery or human trafficking within our supply chains and in any part of our business.

We strive to work ethically and will put control measures in place to ensure no slavery or human trafficking is taking place.

If it is suspected that a supplier or customer is partaking in slavery or human trafficking, we will suspend all business relationships with that company and report to the authorities.
